
Black/African American Population At Greatest Risk for Undercount in New Jersey



In the 2010 Census, the Census Bureau determined that the Black population was undercounted nationwide. The Census determines how billions of dollars in federal funds are distributed.

The Census has low response rates in some areas and among certain population groups such as Black or African American residents, who are at risk of being undercounted.

In New Jersey, **668,636** Black or African American people live in "hard-to-count" (HTC) areas where a low percentage of residents completed and returned their most recent census questionnaire. That comprises **51%** of the total Black population in the state.

This map shows the concentration of Black populations living in "hard-to-count" (HTC) areas, meaning areas with the lowest rate of mailing back their Census forms.
