Policy Update

Despite opposition from advocacy groups such as the League of Women Voters,
Governor Murphy signed the "Elections Transparency Act." The bill allows for increased
political contributions, enables the creation of new "housekeeping" accounts for
political parties, and weakens or eliminates several pay-to-play laws. It also grants Gov.
Murphy the power to appoint new board members to the Election Law Enforcement
Commission, among others. Read more here.
