News from The Fund

Policy Updates

- The Housing Community Development Network of New Jersey (HCDNNJ), Fair Share Housing Center (FSHC), New Jersey Citizen Action (NJCA), and the New Jersey Institute for Social Justice (NJISJ), all celebrated Lieutenant Governor Tahesha Way's signing of <u>legislation</u> that will eliminate discrimination in home appraisals. The law prohibits real estate appraisers from considering certain personal characteristics when determining property value, requires appraisers to complete a fair housing and appraisal bias education course, and provides avenues for property owners to seek remedies for home appraisal discrimination. Read statements from HCDNNJ and FSHC.
- A new dawn to improve New Jersey's primary ballots may be on the horizon. Burlington and Middlesex counties have formally agreed to settle the Conforti v. Hanlon lawsuit seeking to abolish New Jersey's 'county line' ballot design. The League of Women Voters of New Jersey (LWVNJ) and Salvation and Social Justice (SSJ), represented by NJISJ and Campaign Legal Center, applauded the settlement, after having filed an amicus curiae brief in 2021, challenging New Jersey's use of the county line. NJISJ, LWVNJ, SSJ, as well as the New Jersey Alliance for Immigrant Justice and New Jersey Policy Perspective, also filed a separate amicus curiae brief in the Kim v. Hanlon case earlier this year. Grantee Report

New Jersey Policy Perspective reports on the School Funding Reform Act (SFRA)
with <u>Reforming School Funding in New Jersey: Equity For Taxpayers, Excellence For Students</u>. The report provides data-driven recommendations, suggesting a reevaluation of revenue calculations within SFRA that would better address districts' specific needs.
