# **Policy Setbacks**

- A new law, signed in August, increases the time permitted for involuntary psychiatric commitments to a hospital, contingent upon a medical team securing a temporary court order. The American Civil Liberties Union of New Jersey argues that the law curtails a patient's right to consent and further exposes patients to racial and gender-based biases within the health care system. - Last month, despite criticism from groups like the New Jersey Alliance for Immigrant Justice, a federal judge ruled a New Jersey law banning contracts with the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency unconstitutional. The ruling allows the CoreCivic-operated Elizabeth Detention Center to remain open, after being slated to close. CoreCivic's contract, which was to expire at the end of August, is now expected to be extended for an additional 12 months. Read more about the ruling here; view NJAIJ's full statement here.
- A Monmouth University poll shows that support for the construction of offshore wind farms has taken a steep decline, from 84% a decade ago, to 74% four years ago, to 54% on the most recent poll. The poll results coincide with a recent announcement that New Jersey's leading offshore wind developer faces new fiscal challenges which could further delay the project into 2026. Advocacy organizations such as Environment New Jersey credit a series of misinformation campaigns targeting offshore wind as a key contributor to declines in public support.
